INTRODUCTION

Noe John Joseph Endencio Sacramento is an Assistant Professor 7 of Political Science (Public Policy and Administration) at the College of Social Sciences, University of the Philippines Cebu. He is also a non-residential Adjunct Faculty at the School of Public Policy, Chiang Mai University, Thailand. He specializes in political science, public administration, and public policy. His research outputs focus on critical policy studies, community development and politics. Recently, most of his works centers on the his interest on policy research involving narratives and discourses, deliberative spaces, the role of power, emotions, and the critical-pragmatic approach to planning and policy practice.

He has been awarded the Chiang Mai University Presidential Scholarship in 2020 and the University of the Philippines System Faculty, REPS, and Administrative Staff Development Program Fellowship in 2021 to 2025 for his Doctor of Philosophy in Public Policy (International Program). Consequently, he was selected and awarded as part of the first batch of the International Scholars under the ASEAN PhD Fellowship Program on 16 October 2020 by the Indian Ministry of Education for the Doctor of Philosophy in the Humanities and Social Sciences (Agricultural Policy or Policy Studies) in the Indian Institute of Technology Madras (*personally waived due to the heightened threats of COVID-19 pandemic*). In 2023, he was awarded the Walailak University Graduate Scholarship for his Master of Management in Managament (International Program) degree with the College of Graduate Studies, and in 2024, the Thammasat University Promotion for Research internationality and Diverse Education (PRIDE) Scholarship for International Students for his Doctor of Philosophy in Integrated Science of Built Environment with the Faculty of Architecture and Planning.

Some of his prestigious academic and professional achievements includes an award in 2022 from the University of the Philippines Cebu Faculty Grant for Outstanding Teaching, Research, and Public Service in political science (public policy), and the University of the Philippines System One UP Faculty Grant Award for Outstanding Research and Public service in political science (public policy). He was also awarded in 2023 Gawad Chancellor for Outstanding Achievements in Teaching, Research, and Public Service as an Assistant Professor, across the University of the Philippines Cebu.
